50 YEARS

The Ontario Skeet Shooting Association held the first provincial skeet championships at the St. Catharine's Gun Club, May 1947, a nonregistered tournament. Now 50 years later, the 50th Provincial Skeet Championships were held at the Oshawa Skeet and Gun Club, August 1-3. Robert C. Mills shot at both the first and fiftieth, with many in between and received a commemorative plaque from Bill Marsh for this achievement.

With more than five years of planning and fund-raisers, the "50th" will be remembered by many as the shoot of a lifetime. Each participant in the main events received a commemorative 50th personalized name pin, a belt buckle (with 14 karat gold trim), a crest and a lapel pin.

The doubles event started on Friday morning with 48 entries. John Ellis took the championship while Gary Mills bested Rick Lawry in a shoot-off for runner-up.

The .410 event had 74 entries—
a "first" in the history of the Ontario
Skeet Championships. Two 100s were
posted by Ron Colin and John
Loveday—firsts with the .410 for both
shooters. True sportsmanship prevailed as Loveday delayed shoot-offs
to Saturday as Colin had to leave the
shoot on OSSA business. Loveday
emerged as champion.

Saturday morning was bright and sunny with large white clouds. Out of 75 entries, Egon Manthey was the sole 100 in the 28 gauge to win the Egon S. Manthey Trophy which he donated years ago and won for the first time. In the 20

gange event, Gary Mills and Steve Loveday were the only 100s and Mills won the shoot-off for champion.

The final event of the weekend was the 12 gauge with 93 entries. Even with near perfect conditions, only four 100s were posted. After the shoot-offs, Rick Lawry emerged as champion, John Loveday took runner-up, Steve Loveday AA1 and Tom Marsh (shooting his first ever 100) took D1.

Congratulations to John Loveday, the HAA champion with a 492x500

and the HOA championship with a 396x400. The prestigious B.C. (Barney) Hartman Trophy was presented to John for his HOA by Egon

beating Butler. Lee, after a year off from the sport, took third, beating all other 99s. Booher took AAA and the AA Class was won by Mike Leith. A, B, C and D Classes were won by Kevin Davis, Doc Walker, Carl Furuta and Billy Bottorf respectively.

Holt's 100 in the .410 gave him his lock on the HOA championship with the first 400x400 state championship in a long time. Congratulations, Brian!

Tiller won her runner-up shootoff against Butler with their impressive 399s. Herkowitz was no pushover, shooting 397 for AAA. Davis
was only one behind Herkowitz for
AA (396). Kerry Barstow took A Class
with a 392 while young veteran
Wayland Morrison beat Art Lim and
Lee Morris in a shoot-off of 384s for
B1 HOA.

Bill Varie tasted victory in the C HOA shoot-off over Randy Trent. Rookies Don Imhoof and Robert Varie won D and E HOA respectively.

At our annual board meeting, the officers voted to return next year's California Championships to Pachmayr in Southern California. The club has ten fields, pro shop, RV sites and all the other amenities needed for California shooters. Management, including Art Bright and Paula Lobadie, made sure that the facilities and staff were up to the challenge and we look forward to seeing them next year.

We would be remiss if we did not acknowledge mammoth efforts by Barry Hartmann on the scoreboard, Jerry King and Curt Paul on the fields, Rick Anderson on the computer with Dale Koprinik plus Dave MacDonald at registration.

We also owe a warm "thank you" to Steve Kramer and Steve Tucker for the neat shirts (design and silk screening). To Mike Miles from Bakersfield who printed our program. It looked great, better than last year, Mike.

Thanks to Linda Mooney, our cashier of many years, and to Royce Israel for a great job at shoot-off time. Finally, our 1997 President, Anthony Lucidi and his wife, Helene did a wonderful job putting the shoot together.





Douglas Steed Sr. 1942-2022

I am sad to share that after a brief battle with cancer, Canadian Skeet Shooting Hall of Fame member Doug Steed Sr has passed away.

I don't remember when I first met Doug. I started shooting skeet about 25 years ago and undoubtedly, he was there. Not long after, I got involved with the Capital of Canada. Doug was our chief referee, and so began our long working relationship. As I took on roles with the OSSA and the CSC, I could always count on Doug to come and referee. Over the years, it was just understood that if there was a shoot on, that he would be there.

It is very difficult to properly quantify Doug's service to our skeet shooting community. Quite simply, events cannot run with without referees. Refereeing skeet is not a profitable venture. The people who do this job, do so for love of the game. Doug spent over 50 years travelling across the province (and sometimes a little further) making our game better. Doug was a shoot management's dream. He was an AAA resource to

One time I had a great lesson on Ammo and Gun malfunction. He said you shoot a browning and there are times click no fire. I asked him how do you know its not a gun malfunction but ammo when you get that click. He said when you open the Gun I look for 2 things is there a mark on the primer or no mark . No mark may mean gun malfunction but you must look at primer is it set too deep then you have a decision gun or ammo . If primer is flush easy to say gun not so much with low primer .Certainly a primer that's struck but not fired is ammo

I had the great pleasure and good fortune over the years to be refereed by Doug at many shoots and always learned something in how he conducted the squad

Doug you will be missed on the skeet field but the memory of you refereeing those squads will always be there

Good day everyone,

NSSA News Briefs

I wanted to pass on some news regarding the NSSA and the upcoming World Championships in San Antonio this October.

A few weeks ago I had an email sent out to all of the Zone 8 members of the NSSA about my experiences regarding Covid-19 while in Florida for a few weeks in the winter. Essentially, even in Florida, Linda and I felt safe and frankly, the safety precautions and procedures in the US are very similar to what we see in Ontario right now. If you are going to the US, just be aware of the fact that Americans do not seem to know how long six feet is, and there are hundreds of thousands of hand sanitizer dispensers in the US, but they are all empty. So, bring your own sanitizer, and if you want space...wear a mask in public spaces, because that is a signal that you are infected and have chosen to go out in public anyway!!

On June 10, 2022, the U.S. Government announced that it would end pre-arrival COVID testing for international travelers entering the U.S. by air beginning on June 12, 2022. This will make it much easier to travel to San Antonio for anyone choosing to fly down

One other thing that I am asked about frequently, is what the ammunition situation is like down in the US. Frankly, it is not any better than we are seeing here. There are lots of 12 and 20 gauge ammo for sale, some 28 gauge and hardly any .410. What we have been able to arrange for Non American attendees at the World's is that **you** can pre book and prepay for your ammo that you will use down there. This is not available for Americans as they have many options to get their ammo shipped to the National Shooting Complex in San Antonio. The best idea is to bring your own, but if you cannot drive...you can have the ammunition set aside for you. FYI, Malcolm's Cargo is already overweight (both trailer and driver)...so don't ask.

Rick Lawry is being inducted into the Shooter Category of the NSSA Hall of Fame this year, and Doug Steed Sr. (RIP) will be officially going into the Referee Section of the HOF, so this would be a good reason to attend the Hall of Fame Banquet.

I have included the registration link for the World Championships below. For first time attendees this can be quite confusing, so if you have questions, please don't hesitate to reach out to me, via email (steve.malcolm23@gmail.com) or phone (905-967-2458). Be forewarned, if I don't recognize your number, I won't pick up...so leave a message and I will call you back.
