For 2024, the BOD respectfully requests that Members/Clubs complete and return the appropriate fillable Application Form (renewal) to the OSSA Secretary by 29 February 2024. The appropriate Fees are to be remitted to the Treasurer by 29 February 2024.

For Members / Clubs preferring not to use the EMT option, please address remittances payable to the Ontario Skeet Shooting Association (OSSA) and include it with the completed Application and return both via Canada Post.

Note: Membership acknowledgement within the organization requires receipt of both the completed form and payment.

### Ontario Skeet Shooting Association - All Star Awards

Each year, the Ontario Skeet Shooting Association (OSSA) recognizes Ontario shooters that achieve a level of excellence. This level of excellence is demanding on the shooter and indicates their commitment to the sport over the course of the shooting season - both in results and travel.

The awards are based on a number of eligibility criteria. All targets are eligible for consideration; although, a specific number of targets are required to be shot in Ontario and a candidate is required to attend a certain number of Clubs in Ontario over the course of the shooting season. Please Note:

The Canadian Championships (when held in Ontario), the Ontario Open and Closed Provincial Championships, and the Zone 8 are considered as "individual Clubs"; no matter where in Ontario they are held.

The award is identified for the Current Calendar Year with the values from the Previous Calendar Year assessed against the criteria for eligibility.

### All Star Award Selection Criteria

- A candidate is required to attend three (3) Clubs in Ontario for each gauge and / or doubles. In addition, the candidate is required to attend the Ontario Open and Closed Provincial Championships.
- In the event a candidate is unable to attend the Ontario Open and Closed Provincial Championships, he/she is required to attend four (4) Clubs in Ontario for each gauge and / or doubles.
- The candidate's year-end average in each gun / doubles is to meet NSSA's Classification of A-Class, or higher, for eligibility.
- The candidate is required to meet the minimum number of targets for each gauge / doubles to be eligible for consideration (see table).
- A five-person team will be selected for each of the 4-Guns and Doubles based on the highest average in the Gun / Doubles and with each candidate achieving ALL the selection criteria.
- A five-person team shall be selected for High Over All (HOA) based on the average of each gun average for the year. For clarification, the year-end averages of 12, 20, 28, and .410 are summed and divided by four for an overall average. For HOA, the stipulation of Class A or higher is not required. A candidate must have been eligible for All Star consideration in each gauge / bore to be eligible for HOA consideration as an All Star.

The above became effective 18 April 2023 and is retroactive to Calendar Year 2022 Averages for the 2023 All Star Teams. It will remain in effect for a minimum of two (2) years, unless circumstances require a review (example, global pandemic, loss of events, etc.).

### Complimentary **Memberships**

The NSSA for the past several years has offered a Limited Complimentary Membership for new shooters to try registered skeet. The OSSA has matched this program with a free annual membership to our provincial association. The Board of Directors of the OSSA has confirmed that these complimentary memberships will continue for 2024. This membership is available to those shooters who have never shot registered skeet prior to 2024. Shooters must be a member of both NSSA and OSSA to shoot registered skeet in Ontario. We are encouraging shoot directors to introduce registered skeet shooting to as many new members as possible. As a new registered shooter you are receiving a NSSA Limited Membership (\$40 US Value )and OSSA membership (\$25 Value) .You may register for these membership at a registered shoot or by contacting your club skeet shoot director. This is a great way to attend registered shoots for the year. Remember ,in registered shooting you shoot in your own class so you don't have to be the worlds best shooter before you try registered shooting.

ONTARIO, CANADA—Reg Hooper from London, Ontario set a new HOA record at the Orillia Gun Club on June 11-12. With 100 straight in the 12 gauge and 99s in the other three guns, Hooper finished with an amazing 397x400, the highest score ever shot at the Orillia Gun Club.

Only two targets behind and shooting for the first time at Orillia, Brad McRae was runner-up with 395. In the 12 gauge event, both Hooper and McRae ran 100s with McRae winning the shoot-

Brent Wintermute (CH) and (RU) posted 100s in the 28 gauge. was now 200 straight and the one with a shot at being the first to post a 4x4 in Ontario.

Two 100s were also posted in the 20 auge event on Sunday morning by Mike Martin (CH) and Lorne Goodwin (RU).

In the .410 event Hooper claimed the championship with his 99. Al Ego and Wintermute shot off 98s for runnerup with Ego winning the shoot-off.

In addition to Lorne Goodwin's first 100 in 20 gauge, Norm Goodwin shot his first 25 straight in the 20 gauge. Vivian Freitag had her personal best in the .410 with a 95. Jaclyn Ego shot her best 12 gauge with 97. Bob Whitehead het his first NSSA registered targets.

This was also Reg Hooper's best HOA to date, with even better scores to come. Class winners are listed in the Scoreboard section of the magazine.

This is only about 20 Minutes from the club and the hotel is almost brand new. Obviously they are trying to attract people to the Casino and the room I stayed in was spotless with a King bed and was under \$80.00 per night including taxes. I would have expected to pay at least twice that amount for what we got. Obviously, room fees will vary with availability and seasonality, but as an option...I would look into it if you are looking for accommodations. In addition...if you get a "Great Canadian Rewards" card, (which is what you use in the Casino), you get 20% off of the room charge. All in all a great deal and a nice hotel, with a Tim Horton's directly across the road from the hotel. The restaurant in the casino was good too.
