

Knotty Pine 200 History by Frank Stewart

The Knotty pine 200 started in 2001.

I have recorded all hundreds on the KP wall of fame inside the high house, pictures included.

After 22 years there have been 42 hundred straights shot by 23 different shooters.

George Williamson shot the first one back in 2003. Reg Hooper holds the record with 6 including one 2x2

John Kapron has 5 hundreds including two 2x2s, the only one to accomplish this twice, John held the long run record with 354 straight from 2006 until 2014.

Jordy Ireland also has 5 hundreds including one 2x2 and has held the long run record since 2014 with an incredible 376 straight.


