Message from the President. Steve Malcolm

Is it me, or did the summer of 2018 fly by way too fast? Of course two weeks ago I was in Texas at the World Championships enjoying the 30+ weather and later this fall I will be joining many of you in the woods for Moose and Deer Hunting.

Unfortunately, at this point I do not have any statistics to back this up, but anecdotally the season in Ontario was pretty successful. No, there is not an overabundance of shoots to pick and choose from, but those that were held were pretty well attended. The Waterford 4 Gun and the Mariposa Doubles had much better attendance than in the previous year and that is always an encouraging sign, especially for the very few people that organize and host these events.

On November 24th, the Annual General Meeting of the OSSA will be held in the Clubhouse of Uxbridge Shooting Sports. Details are listed elsewhere in the Station 9. As a member of the OSSA, you have the right to attend and vote...and yes, it is even encouraged to speak up and let your voice be heard. Of course, I have always believed that any complaints should simply be a preface for a solution or a suggestion to make things better, so please bring your suggestions and don't be shy about it. One of the subjects that we will be trying to flesh out is a 5 venue, 200 bird event season long competition that has been floated up over the last couple of years. The 200 bird events have proven to be fairly popular as they tend to be less costly (not hotels, one day), so a suggestion has been made to run 5 separate events that are essentially rolled up into one HOA and/or HAA. This is designed to encourage more shooting at more events and increase our participation levels at the various clubs around Ontario. On a final note, I would like to thank Brad McRae for two specific things. One is for running the overall Zone 8 Shoot Program. This encompasses not just clubs in Ontario, but all across Canada as well as the UK, Australia and New Zealand. It is a monumental task and one that requires a lot of patience (which Brad is able to muster up occasionally). The second, is that Brad is stepping forward as the Zone 8 Representative for the Executive Committee (EC) of the National Skeet Shooting Association in San Antonio, Texas. Brad is taking my spot as I have been elected as the Secretary-Treasurer of the Association. Luckily, I don't really have anything to do with the money side of things, because that wouldn't be a good thing. Hopefully, we will see you at the AGM. Until then, be safe out in the woods or blinds!

Report from the Ontario Council of Shooters

For those not aware, the OSSA is a member under the umbrella organization, the OCS, that represents and is the voice of Ontario's target shooting sports associations in all conversations with the provincial government's MTCS, the Ministry of Tourism, Culture and Sport. Six organizations are thus given a single voice. They are: The Ontario Rifle Association; The Ontario Provincial Trapshooting Association; The Ontario Skeet Shooting Association; The Rifle and Pistol Alliance and The Ontario Olympic Trapshooting Association, (through ONTarget); and the MLI Muzzle Loading Association.

As we are all aware, the personal expenses incurred by participants in shooting sports, and in particular clay target sports, have risen dramatically over a very short span in time. But these cost increases are also borne by the associations that strive to maintain and promote their individual sports. Higher costs generally result in a reduction in sport participation and consequently, a reduction in association memberships.

This progression has left associate bodies looking for outside funding, since over-taxing members is just another dis-incentive to membership. Enter.....government grants.

Each member association of the OCS is, to one degree or another, reliant upon these government handouts.

But in order to qualify and apply for these grants, the MTCS has stipulated that certain programs <u>must</u> be undertaken by the member associations; coaching/coach development training has been foremost on their list.

Earlier this year, to fulfill our obligation, notifications were sent to all our OSSA members offering coaching and coach trainer certifications with the promise that the course instruction fees would be reimbursed by the OSSA. It is most gratifying to announce that Jaclyn Ego has completed that requisite training. Jackie's initiative is a credit to her and an asset to the entire OSSA community, as we now have both a certified coach and a certified coaching instructor. As well, we have been informed in a letter dated September 05, 2018, that the OCS is now eligible to receive grant money to support the development of amateur sport shooters over the current and coming year. Thank you, Jaclyn.

- (1) club membership paid from January 1, 2019 December 31, 2019
- (2) application has been approved by the O.S.S.A. (State/Provincial Association)
